

## STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

- All students have the right to work in a safe environment
- All students have the right to equal access of school resources
- All students have the right to participate in the organisation of the school

*Therefore all students have the following Responsibilities*

1. To allow a teaching and learning environment free of disruption
2. To assist in providing an environment free of all forms of harassment and abuse
3. To accept and work within established guidelines for behaviour
4. To be trustworthy and honest
5. To strive for personal best and to respect the successes of others
6. To show respect for self and others
7. To care for and to provide support in time of stress
8. To assist in the elimination of behaviour which damages or destroys school resources
9. To care for the property and possessions of others
10. To encourage others to express and discuss personal opinions
11. To take leadership and responsibilities when appropriate
12. To act according to democratic principles
13. To attend lessons punctually
14. To keep an up to date diary
15. To represent the school positively when in the wider community

## TEACHER CODE OF CONDUCT

**In addition to specific role and responsibility statements all staff will:**

1. treat all members of the school community with respect
2. speak positively about WHS and their employer (DECS)
3. contribute to the implementation of the school's Site Learning Plan
4. use teaching programs that are consistent with the Curriculum Standards and Accountability Framework
5. make a positive contribution to whole school activities
6. use conduct that reflects appropriate professional standards
7. support the enactment of all school and departmental policies
8. continually expand skills and knowledge through self reflection, seeking feedback and participation in professional development activities
9. make a positive contribution to developing and sustaining a productive teaching and learning environment

## **PARENT/CAREGIVER CODE OF CONDUCT**

**Parents or caregivers are encouraged to maximise the chance of their child's success at school by:**

1. ensuring that their child attends school regularly and is punctual
2. notifying the school when the child is absent
3. checking and signing their child's diary / communication book at least once a week to assist with sharing of information
4. providing a quiet place for homework and study at a regular time
5. checking that their child has the correct uniform and equipment for school
6. being aware of, and actively supporting, the school with administrative procedures and behaviour management expectations
7. discussing their child's work with them
8. immediately alerting their child's home group teacher if they have concerns
9. attending meetings held by the school eg information nights, parent / teachers interview nights
